Dear Yolo Bypass Stakeholders:

The Bay Delta Conservation Plan Steering Committee is hosting a Local Issues Group meeting in your area to solicit local input on fishery enhancement in the Yolo Bypass. We would be grateful if you would participate to provide your local perspective.

The meeting will be held Wednesday, October 6, 2010 from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. The location of the meeting will be the Arthur F. Turner Community Public Library, located at 1212 Merkley Avenue in West Sacramento.

The purpose of this Local Issue Group meeting is to provide a forum for local stakeholders to discuss two aspects of the Yolo Bypass-related conservation measure with Steering Committee members and technical staff, including: 1) the concepts contained in the measure as it stands currently, and 2) important details of local interest that will need to be considered in any future implementation efforts.

Your knowledge of the local area and the needs of the community will be especially important and helpful to the Steering Committee in coming months.
